Lessons From The Proverbs 31 Woman

As we continue our study through the poem of the virtuous woman found in Proverbs 31, I want to focus next on verse 26: **When** she speaks, her words are **wise**, and she gives instructions with **kindness**. I can see three key points to draw out from this one verse.

First, the NLT starts this verse with the word **when**. By stating when she speaks, it leads us to believe there is also a time when she does NOT speak. I am the kind of person that appreciates frankness, or a direct approach. My family would say that I am not one for mincing words. So, I appreciate blunt and direct verses like:

Too much talk leads to sin. Be sensible and keep your mouth shut. Proverbs 10:19

The tongue can bring death or life; those who love to talk will reap the consequences. Proverbs 18:21

Whoever guards his mouth preserves his life; he who opens wide his lips comes to ruin. Proverbs 13:3

The virtuous woman who is seeking to honor God is wise enough to know that there is a time to speak and there is a time to tame her tongue. May we be wise enough to guard our mouths and use our words to bring life not death! For more on this topic read James chapter 3.

Secondly, this verse states that when she speaks her words are **wise**.

The lips of the wise give good advice; the heart of a fool has none to give. Proverbs 15:7

Where does this wisdom to give good advice come from? For the Lord grants wisdom! From His mouth come knowledge and understanding (Proverbs 2:6). It is God's Word that teaches us and imparts to us wisdom and understanding. This is why we must be intimate with God's Word. We must hide God's Word in our hearts and meditate on it day and night. 




Keep A Quiet Heart - Elisabeth Elliot
