Lessons From The Proverbs 31 Woman

As we continue our study through the poem of the virtuous woman found in Proverbs 31, I want us to lay our focus next upon verse 30: Charm is deceptive, and beauty does not last; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.

There are two key points I would like to examine from this verse. First, the verse states that beauty does not last. The NIV says that beauty is *fleeting*, while the NKJV says that beauty is passing. I believe this is a very important topic to discuss for women as we often place such a high emphasis on our external qualities. Society and social media scream at us to cling to our youthful external features, while Scripture clearly teaches us that the natural course of the human body is to age and grow old. In fact, Proverbs 16:37 states that "gray hair is the crown of glory." Growing old is a gift from God. May we embrace that gift and not put too much emphasis on maintaining a youthful appearance. I will share some passages regarding what Scripture teaches on our appearance and challenge us individually to self-examine our own lives in this area. We will see that Scripture clearly teaches that godly character is of much more importance than external or physical beauty.

1 Peter 3:3-4 - Don't be concerned about the outward beauty of fancy hairstyles, expensive jewelry, or beautiful clothes. You should clothe yourselves instead with the beauty that comes from within, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is so precious to God.

1 Timothy 2:9-10 - I want women to be modest in their appearance. They should wear decent and appropriate clothing and not draw attention to themselves by the way they fix their hair or by wearing gold or pearls or expensive clothes. For women who claim to be devoted to God should make themselves attractive by the good things they do.

1 Timothy 4:8 - Physical training is good, but training for godliness is much better, promising benefits in this life and in the life to come.

Do you cling to your youth and beauty? Is it too much of a prized possession in your life?

Do you spend more time cultivating godly character or your physical attributes?

Secondly, this woman fears the LORD. There is often a lot of confusion around the usage of the word *fear* here. This is not a fear as in being scared or frightened of God, but rather a fear out of a deep love for God and not wanting to disappoint Him. Because she fears the Lord, the godly woman chooses to do what is right and honorable in all areas of her life. She is intimate with God. She knows His Word and His ways and desires obedience to them. Above all her responsibilities, first and foremost, she desires to please God. She has a sense of awe and majesty of God, holding to a high and healthy reverence and respect for God. A godly woman knows that outer beauty will fade with time, but she also realizes that true beauty lies within. A woman of God understands that her primary responsibility in life is to honor God and, in a world full of distractions, she has resolved to follow God wholeheartedly. Let me encourage each of us to aim for that, all for the glory of our King!

Leah: Genesis 29-35

Both Rachel and her sister Leah had been thrust into a life that was not what they had planned. Leah was the older sister. In this culture, it was customary that she would marry first. But she was not the stunning beauty that her sister was, which certianly she was aware of. Jacob had worked seven years for her sister; but on the eve of the wedding Leah's father hatched a plan that Leah would marry Jacob in disguise. When the wedding was over and morning came, Jacob realized he had been tricked and Leah was now married to a man who never wanted her.

But the Lord saw her. He did not see her as the unwanted bride or rejected one but as His own beloved child. And despite the rejection that she lived with from her husband, we see that she praised the Lord with her life (Gen. 29:35). The Lord would bless her with many children, and she knew that even though she was rejected by her husband, her children were a gift from the Lord.

Though her life may have been filled with longing for a husband who would love her, God gave Leah a purpose far greater than she could have ever dreamed. Certainly there have been times that we have all felt like Leah - times when we compared our life to someone else, times when we felt rejected, and times we felt that we never measured up. But God has a purpose for each of us. He has uniquely created us to fulfill the role that He has made for us, and He sees us right where we are. We can praise Him because even if life is not exactly the way that we had planned, His plan is perfect.


